

## CALL FOR SUBMISSIONS

### **EASP Small Group Meeting on “Advancing Intersectional and Multiple Categorization Research in Social Psychology”**

Chemnitz, Germany • June 26 – 28, 2025

Over the past two decades, intersectionality has evolved from its roots in U.S. Black feminism and legal theory into a global framework for understanding social inequalities across dimensions like race, gender, sexuality, class, nationality, and ability. While it is increasingly applied in social psychology to study identity, stereotyping, and discrimination, much of the well-known research remains U.S.-based. However, significant work is already being conducted outside the U.S. context—albeit in a highly fragmented manner—highlighting the urgent need for dialogue on how to strengthen intersectional research on a global scale.

We are thrilled to announce the EASP Small Group Meeting on Advancing Intersectional and Multiple Categorization Research in Social Psychology, which will bring together 30 to 40 scholars from diverse backgrounds. This meeting aims to advance the integration of intersectionality into social psychology globally, fostering networking, idea exchange, and collaborative research.

#### **Key objectives of the meeting include:**

- Advancing intersectional theories
- Adapting intersectionality to non-U.S. contexts and integrating it with related approaches like multiple social categorization
- Addressing methodological challenges in intersectional research
- Building a cross-national research network

The meeting is open to researchers worldwide. We will prioritize submissions from EASP members and ensure that at least one-third of participants are early-career researchers. Scholars from underrepresented countries and demographics are especially encouraged to apply.

There is no participation fee. Reception, lunch, and dinner will be provided for all three days. Early-career scholars and participants from underrepresented groups or low-income countries may apply for additional funding to cover accommodation and travel costs.

#### **Conference Format**

The meeting will take place in Chemnitz, Germany, from June 26 to June 28, 2025. Our program is designed to foster discussions between experienced scholars in intersectional psychology and researchers looking to incorporate intersectionality into their work. It will feature workshops led by experienced participants, individual presentations from scholars across career stages, and moderated group discussions to encourage collaboration and knowledge sharing.

## **Submission Guidelines**

We invite 300-word abstracts (one submission per applicant) in one of the following formats:

### **For researchers already applying intersectionality in their work or studying multiple categorization:**

- **Talk Proposals** – Share findings from intersectional or multiple categorization research projects.
- **Workshop Proposals** – Propose a workshop you could lead or co-lead (e.g., applying diverse methods in intersectional research, integrating intersectional perspectives into research practices).

### **For researchers interested in incorporating intersectionality into their work for the first time:**

- **Research Statements** – Describe your current research and how it could benefit from intersectional approaches.

### **Relevant research interests (including but not limited to):**

- Multiple social categorization
- Intersectional stereotyping
- Multiple social identities
- Identity conflict and integration
- (Coping with) discrimination and group-based hierarchies
- Multiculturalism, Diversity, and inclusion
- Heteronormativity and the gender/sex binary
- Cross-cultural psychology
- Feminist and critical psychology

We will begin reviewing submissions immediately after the application deadline and will notify all applicants of acceptance or rejection no later than **March 10, 2025**.
